To all CAMI Assembly team members:

Do you feel that students understand the world of work or know the challenges people experience on the job? Like many parents of students in grade nine, your answer is probably “no”. Young people, at this age, are just beginning to see the world beyond themselves, their families and their immediate communities. They may have little understanding or appreciation of what work is about, or the importance of education to their success in the working world.

Take Our Kids to Work Day TM is an initiative of the Learning Partnership, a not-for-profit organization of business people, educators and community leaders committed to creating challenging learning and career opportunities for young people. The organization aims to show them, through direct experience, just how important skills, training and education are to their success.

That is why CAMI Assembly & Unifor Local 88 are taking part in this program as workplace hosts for grade nine students. Grade nine was selected for a number of reasons. Provincial curriculum guidelines include career education at this level and it is an opportune time for students to see the practical side of what they have learned in school. Grade nine students also make course selections for the following year that could have an impact on their futures. By exploring work in a meaningful way, they can ask themselves critical questions as they make educational decisions.

If you have a child in grade nine, this program is an opportunity for him/her to learn about what we do here to support our families. Students will be provided the opportunity to see the realities of the workplace that can play a role in helping them prepare for their future. CAMI & Unifor Local 88 are planning a full day of activities including a plant tour.

Before completing the form, please note the following points:

- The program begins in the **Auditorium at 7:00 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m.**
- Parents are responsible for getting their grade nine student to and from CAMI at the appropriate times
- Parents are invited to join their child for a **Pizza lunch at 11:00 in the Main Cafeteria.**
- **Parents on A or C shift** may switch shifts if possible – following the proper approval process. Parents on vacation are not allowed to stay with students.
- All students of both salary and hourly team members will participate in a full day of activities, workshops and plant tour – **there will be no direct job shadowing.**

Students must wear proper footwear – no open toe or high heel shoes – safety glasses will be provided. Students will need to wear their hair up and should not wear hooded sweat shirts.

AUTHORIZATION TO REPRODUCE A PHYSICAL LIKENESS**
